




Self is on the throne Interests are directed by self, often resulting in discord & frustration Christ is outside

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

Christ is in the life and on the throne Self is yielding to Christ


Interests are directed by Christ, resulting in harmony with God's plan.



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

How did Solomon struggle with Lordship issues, even though he was the wisest man and richest king who'd ever lived?


(see the whole, tragic "support the wives as they just do their thing" mistake in 1 Kings 11, etc.)
