Our Tongues

- How important are our tongues—i.e.; the words that our lips and mouths form?
 - So let's end on some positive applications
 - What kinds of words should we be sharing, and why?
(think about some of what we talked about *last* time)



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 - What kinds of words should we be sharing, and why?
 - What should our *attitudes* be like, *behind* our tongues?
 - Please read Psalm 34:12-14
 - Why are two out of the five (or six) things listed here about desiring “good days” in life involving what we do with our tongues?
 - Doesn't that last bit telling us to “seek peace and pursue it” *a/so* often involve our words? Why or why not?
(NOTE: This is arguably not two *separate* commands, but a command with a logical extension—so why clarify that we shouldn't just “seek” peace but actively “pursue” it?)



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 - Please read Psalm 34:12-14
 - Please read Ephesians 4:22-25
 - How do our base desires “corrupt” our soul?
(NOTE: the Greek word “φθείρω” or “*phtheirō*” is different than the one that we talked about last time—this is referring to a *spiritual* or *moral* corruption that defiles and shrivels your soul)



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 - How do our base desires “corrupt” our soul?
 - How is how we speak to one another such a crucial part of putting on the new attitude of mind and the new, redeemed “self”—such a crucial part of countering the corrupted “old self” that we've been saved from?



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 - Please read Psalm 34:12-14
 - Please read Ephesians 4:22-27
 - How do our base desires “corrupt” our soul?
 - How does Paul give us a solid application of this in Ephesians 4:26-27?
 - Why is this such a crucial “rule of thumb” for us to follow?
 - Doesn't your anger just... kinda... *abate*... overnight?
 - How can letting your anger settle in (or fester and morph into something else) “give the Devil [the “Accuser”] a foothold” in your life (or in your marriage, or in your job, or in your church, or in your...)?
