- Remember our definition of a "cult"
 - ▶ I've recommended six questions to ask yourself about any religious groups that seem at least potentially suspicious to you...
 - 1. Does the group have a prophet/founder who is revered by followers and claims to have special revelation from God or from angels?
 - 2. Are there authoritative writings or scriptures in addition to or instead of the Bible?
 - 3. Does the group view itself as the one *true* church, founded because the *true* gospel was lost in the early centuries of the church?
 - 4. What does the group believe regarding the Trinity? Is Jesus fully God, the second person of the Trinity? Is the Holy Spirit fully God, the third person of the Trinity?
 - 5. How does the group believe we are saved? By grace alone, through faith in Jesus Christ, or by faith plus good works?
 - 6. What belief does the group hold regarding life after death? What is its concept of Heaven and Hell?




Let's go through our six questions...

Who is their founder?

Joseph Smith, who was was born in Vermont in 1805 but grew up in west New York's "burnt district"

♣ He and his father were famous in the area for being paid to use their "peep stones" to find buried treasure for people in the forest (even though he was sued at least twice for fraud, and forced to admit under oath that "he could not see in a stone now, nor never could; and that his former pretensions in that respect were all false. He then promised to give up his old habits of digging for money and looking into stones...")





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
He and his father were famous in the area for being paid to use their "peep stones" to find buried treasure for people in the forest But in 1820, he was visited by God the Father and

Jesus Christ, who informed him that every existing Christian church was false and corrupt

Years later, the angel Moroni appeared to him and told him to use his "peep stone" to find and dig up a series of golden plates which Moroni had buried in New York 1,200 years before, when he

was still just a human, Jewish prophet

 Once translated from their original Reformed Egyptian, the plates gave Smith the text that became the Book of Mormon —and last week, we discussed several issues related to all of that...




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Do they have any authoritative writings or scriptures in addition to or instead of the Bible?

The Book of Mormon, The Doctrine and Covenants, The Pearl of Great Price, Articles of Faith, etc.

The problem is, once you start "tweaking" the Truth, then you kind of have to keep tweaking it, because your tweaks don't hold up under scrutiny since you've damaged Truth's structural integrity

So, a series of new prophecies and pronouncements have emerged over the years to subtly and/or significantly change Mormonism here and there to increasingly distance the religion from orthodox Christianity...

COVENANTS

"My object in going to inquire of the Lord was to know which of all the sects [i.e.; Christian churches] was right, that I might know which to join. No sooner, therefore, did I get possession of myself, so as to be able to speak, than I asked the Personages who stood above me in the light, which of all the sects was right (for at this time it had never entered into my heart that all were wrong) and which I should join. I was answered that I must join none of them, for they were all wrong; and the Personage who addressed me said that all their creeds were an abomination in his sight; that those professors were all corrupt; that: 'they draw near to me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me, they teach for doctrines the commandments of men, having a form of godliness, but they deny the power thereof.' He again forbade me to join with any of them..."

 - Does the group view itself as the one true church, founded because the true gospel was lost in the early centuries of the church?
 - "My object in going to inquire of the Lord was to know which of all the sects [i.e.; Christian churches] was right, that I might know which to join..."
 - It was revealed to Smith that "the Lord would cut short His work in righteousness and except the Church receive the fulness of the Scriptures that they would yet fail. Upon my return from Amherst Conference, I resumed the translation of the Scriptures [i.e.; the Book of Mormon]. From sundry revelations which had been received, it was apparent that many important points touching the salvation of men had been taken from the Bible, or lost before it was compiled."


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♦ It was revealed to Smith that "the Lord would cut short His work in righteousness and except the Church receive the fulness of the Scriptures that they would yet fail..."

God explained, "Verily, verily, I say unto you, that there are records which contain much of my gospel, which have been kept back because of the wickedness of the people; And now I command you, that if you have good desires—a desire to lay up treasures for yourself in heaven—then shall you assist in bringing to light, with your gift, those parts of my scriptures which have been hidden because of iniquity. And now, behold, I give unto you, and also unto my servant Joseph, the keys of this gift, which shall bring to light this ministry..."


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early centuries of the church?

Let's go through our six questions...

Does the group view itself as the one true church, founded because the true gospel was lost in the early centuries of the church?

• Questions were put to Smith about the LDS faith, which he specifically answered in his Teachings: First—"Do you believe the Bible?"

Smith—"If we do, we are the only people under heaven that does, for there are none of the

religious sects of the day that do."

Second—"Wherein do you differ from other sects?" Smith—"In that we believe the Bible, and all other sects profess to believe their interpretations of the Bible, and their creeds."

Third—"Will everybody be damned, but Mormons?" Smith—"Yes, and a great portion of them, unless they repent, and work righteousness."

▶ Please remember this the next time that a Mormon says, "We're just Christians, the same as you..." (NOTE: It's not uncommon for Mormons to be very uncomfortable seeing any non-Mormons as anything but ongoing missions projects —and to shun any truly active Christians)

What does the group believe regarding the Trinity? Is Jesus fully God, the second person of the Trinity? Is the Holy Spirit fully God, the third person of the Trinity?

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"There are two personages who constitute the great, matchless, governing and supreme power over all things—by whom all things were created and made, that are created and made, whether visible or invisible: whether in heaven, on earth, or in the earth, under the earth, or throughout the immensity of space—They are the Father and the Son: The Father being a personage of spirit, glory and power: possessing all perfection and fulness: The Son, who was in the bosom of the Father, a personage of tabernacle, made, or fashioned like unto man, or being in the form and likeness of man, or, rather, man was formed after his likeness, and in his image..."

—Joseph Smith, in his Lectures on Faith

(NOTE: The *Lectures* were at one point part of the Doctrine and Covenants, but were later removed because they no longer reflected official church doctrine—specifically, that the Father is a "personage of *spirit...*")

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

Joseph Smith got that information from studying his papyri—particularly the one described as a "singular scrawl"

(NOTE: In an episode of Battlestar Galactica, èvolved, benevolent aliens told our heroes, "As you are now, we once were; as we now are, you may become..."—same idea)





Oh, you may laugh, but Battlestar Galactica's creator, Glen A. Larson, was a devout Mormon

So he made a TV show about a lost, vaguely Egyptiany tribe on a lonely voyage to a place they've never seen (just like the Nephites had been)

—a tribe that is governed by a Quorum of Twelve—

(just like the Mormons are)

as they launch out from the planet of the gods, Kobol (just like our God did from Kolob)

under the wise and benevolent guidance of Adama (just like Adam—the name that God took on Earth)

 - What does the group believe regarding the Trinity? Is Jesus fully God, the second person of the Trinity? Is the Holy Spirit fully God, the third person of the Trinity?
 - "When our father Adam came into the garden of Eden, he came into it with a celestial body, and brought Eve, one of his wives, with him. He helped to make and organize this world. He is Michael, the Archangel, the Ancient of Days! about whom holy men have written and spoken—He is our Father and our God, and the only God with whom we have to do... When the virgin Mary conceived the child Jesus, the father had begotten him in his own likeness. He was not begotten by the Holy Ghost. And who was the father? He was the first of the human family... Jesus our elder brother was begotten in the flesh by the same character that was in the Garden of Eden and who is our father in heaven."

Funky little teaching moment...

◆ So to sum up—our God was born and raised on the planet Kolob, then came here to start His own planet,

calling himself "Adam"

(or Michael—though, to be fair, not every Mormon believes that Adam-God thing nowadays—and many forget that any Mormon ever even preached that, such as Quorum member Bruce McConkie—

"There are those who believe or say they believe that Adam is our father and our god, that he is the father of our spirits and our bodies, and that he is the one we worship. The devil keeps this heresy alive as a means of obtaining converts to cultism. It is contrary to the whole plan of salvation set forth in the scriptures, and anyone who has read the Book of Moses, and anyone who has received the temple endowment, has no excuse whatever for being led astray by it."

—Bruce McConkie, in his Seven Deadly Heresies speech "Forget everything that I have said, or what President Brigham Young or George Q. Cannon or whoever has said in days past that is contrary to the present revelation."








Funky little teaching moment...

 So to sum up—our God was born and raised on the planet Kolob, then came here to start His own planet, calling himself "Adam"

* "Many men say there is one God; the Father, the Son and the Holy Ghost are only one God! I say that is a strange God anyhow—three in one, and one in three! It is a curious organization. All are to be crammed into one God, according to sectarianism. It would make the biggest God in all the world. He would be a wonderfully big God—he would be a giant or a monster..."



—Joseph Smith, Teachings of Joseph Smith (NOTE: The ironic thing is that, even though Smith is being sarcastically dismissive of the orthodox doctrine of the Trinity, I actually half-agree with him —yes, God <u>is</u> wonderfully big...)





Funky little teaching moment...

Smith preached at Elder King Follet's funeral:
 "God was once as we are now, an exalted man, and sits

enthroned in yonder heavens... I say, if you were to see Him today, you would see Him like a man in form—like yourselves and all the person, image and very form of man. I'm going to tell you how God came to be God. We have imagined and supposed that God was God from all eternity. I will refute that idea, and take away the veil, so that you may see. It is the first principle of the Gospel to know for certainty the character of God, to know that we may converse with Him as one man converses with another, and that he was once a man like us, yea, that god Himself, the Father of us all, dwelt on an earth the same as Jesus Christ did... Here then is eternal life--to know the only wise and true God, and you have got to learn how to be gods yourselves, and to be kings and priests, the same as all gods before you, namely by going from one small degree to another, and from a small capacity to a great one, from grace to grace, from exaltation to exaltation, until you attain to the resurrection of the dead and are able to dwell in the everlasting burnings, and to sit in glory, as do those

- Let's break out the main points there for a second:
- "I say, if you were to see Him today, you would see Him like a man in form—like yourselves and all the person, image and very form of man..."
- "I'm going to tell you how God came to be God. We have imagined and supposed that God was God from all eternity. I will refute that idea, and take away the veil..."
- "It is the first principle of the Gospel to know for certainty the character of God, to know that we may converse with Him as one man converses with another, and that he was once a man like us..."
- "Here then is eternal life—to know the only wise and true God, and you have got to learn how to be gods yourselves, and to be kings and priests, the same as all gods before you..."

- Jesus Christ "is the image of the invisible God" (Colossians 1:15) and "God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in spirit and in truth" (John 4:24)
- "Before me no god was formed, nor will there be one after me" (Isaiah 43:10) and "from everlasting to everlasting you are God" (Psalm 90:2)
- "How unsearchable his judgments, and his paths beyond tracing out! Who has known the mind of the Lord?" (Romans 11:33-34) and "the Father of the heavenly lights... does not change like shifting shadows" (James 1:17)
- "This is eternal life: that they may know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent"—it was Satan who said, "your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God" (Genesis 3:5)
