1. What sorts of ways can we be tempted to want to distort (or at least to want to try not to think about) various Scriptures to better fit our existing personal paradigms? Be specific.

- 3. Why do you think that people like Jesus or James or Paul all so consistently taught us to start by focusing on letting God change *us* before we ask Him to change the people and conditions *around* us? How can verses like Romans 12:2 or Psalm 139:23-24 help remind us to reorient ourselves toward letting God and His priorities set the tone for our own priorities? How can we pray for one another to do that better and more consciously?
