INTERACTIVE DISCUSSION FOR AFTER THE SERVICE

1. What sorts of things have people been missing the most over these couple of weeks of "shelter-in-place" and being stuck at home? Please be specific and list the ones that *you've* missed the most. How many of these things were truly needs, and how many of them were simply luxuries that we've enjoyed in the past? Again, please be specific.

This is a season of Lent, when many people choose to give up things (chocolate, coffee, Netflix, etc.) for a few weeks to try to empathize with the suffering that Christ went through in His crucifixion and death. How is this unchosen and indefinite time of "going without" perhaps a *better* opportunity for us to learn an appreciation for His suffering? How is it an even *better* opportunity for us to learn an appreciation for our *blessings*? How can we actively use this time itself to sharpen and focus our worship?

- 2. Jesus was on His way to Jerusalem to be glorified as a King and later crucified as a rebel. Why do *you* think that He stopped on His way to spend time with a man like Zacchaeus? How might that have helped clarify and focus His perspective on what was coming up for Himself over the next week? Again, please be specific. What would help *you* clarify and focus *your* perspective on what is coming up for *you* over the next week? No, you don't know all of the details of what will happen over the next seven days, but God does -- and you already know what you <u>need</u> to do and to be versus what you'd <u>like</u> to do and to be. So what should *your* perspective be like this week? Again, please be specific.
- 3. Do you know any Zacchaeuses in your own life (i.e.; people whom you think are lost causes -- or perhaps even people that you'd prefer *not* to sit next to in church)? What can you do to change your perspective about them to the perspective that you *need* to have?
- 4. God prepared Zacchaeus, and the owners of the donkey, and even the donkey itself. He's not playing "catch-up" to this world and its strange left turns -- He's planning and putting things in place already for those moments. So how has God prepared *you* for this time? How has He prepared your situation for *this moment* in history? Again, please be specific.
- 5. Take a moment and pray with one another, praying for one another specifically to be able to do and to be what <u>*God*</u> needs you to do and to be, and to let the rest shrink in priority.
